<u>Dundalk Grammar School – Review of Academic Year 2022-23 presented by the Headmaster at the</u> PTA AGM on Wednesday 4th October 2023.

Academic, cultural and sporting achievement

The Leaving Certificate class of 2022 comprised of 88 students. Students received their results following a full return to the traditional leaving certificate model. 25 students achieved over 500 points, representing 28% of the cohort. This year, our DGS students attained an average score of 435 points. The trend of a strong uptake at higher level continued amongst the 2022 cohort while individual results compare favourably with national averages.

<u>Student Support Team:</u> HM outlined DGS's new Student Support Team led by Mr Alan Norton, and thanked all the staff members who have volunteered to support students in this new initiative.

<u>Annual Award Ceremony:</u> DGS's Annual Awards Ceremony held on Friday 23rd September 2022 with special guest speaker Mr Jonathan Shackleton, cousin of the Antarctic explorer Sir Ernest Shackleton. This event was the first inperson event since September of 2019. HM thanked all those involved in the preparation of the day, especially Mr Ian Moore for collating and organising the awards.
